DID YOU KNOW

A generation ago, kindergarten was supposed to get children ready for school. But now everyone is talking about the importance of "school readiness" before children get into kindergarten. That is why many parents, anxious for their children to succeed in school, want early education programs to have children sit at tables using work sheets, drills, and flash cards to learn letters and numbers and even start to read, add and subtract.

Preschoolers learn differently from school-age children: play is essential to early learning. Play is the main way children learn and develop ideas about the world. It helps them build the skills necessary for critical thinking and leadership. It's how they learn to problem solve and to feel good about their ability to learn. Play is not a break from learning – it's the way young children learn.
